CREMATION MEMORIALIZATION

The trend toward cremation is on the rise. Along with this trend is the misconception that permanent memorials and inurnment are not always part of the process. That is so wrong because in reality cremation opens up many options, from simpler to most creative permanent burials. In response to the rising rate of cremation, Cedar Lawn and Fair View are offering increasing options for cremation memorialization at a wide variety of price points. Several new products have been added this fall (2018) and are on display at the Cremation Cross in Cedar Lawn.

THE GROWTH OF CREMATION

Cremation rates are steadily approaching fifty percent. In the past year, our cremation burials are about twenty-five percent, but we know many families have not contacted us for "post need" arrangements. We expect cremation area development to continue as a key component for future growth. We hope to attract the younger generation and new business.

CREMATION OPTIONS

Many options are available for permanent memorial when cremation is chosen. These may include symbols



of hobbies, interests, religion or military service to value a loved one. In response to increasing interest we are offering new cremation products each year. These new options are on display in the cremation cross located at Cedar Lawn Memorial Park, several are pictured on this page. Please take the time to make your family aware of the possibilities.

VARIETY OF PRICE POINTS

Until recently cremations in both cemeteries were limited to in-ground, columbarium, and estate benches. People are asking for variety in product and price. The recent additions; bird baths, pillars, posts, etc can be less expensive while still answering the desire for permanent memorial.

We finally have a newly constructed Maintenance and Storage building. In the 2007 newsletter, we kicked off a fund-raising campaign to build this new building. The good news today is the building is complete and paid in full (approximately \$45,000).



This is a steel-frame building with vertical metal siding. The enclosed area is 30' by 30' and 12' high, plus a covered carport 10' by 30'. This triples the work space for the grounds crew as well as secure storage space for equipment. We now have a good place to work on repairing and refinishing bronze markers, a new in-house service.
