
INTEGRATING TRADITIONAL **BURIAL AND CREMATION**

CONTINUING TO IMPROVE WITH YOUR GENEROSITY

Included in this newsletter, you will find an acknowledgement of contributors to the Fair View Foundation from November 2011 through October 2012. We published the first list of contributors in the 1984 newsletter and have continued to do so each year since that date. Over half a million dollars has been generously contributed since 1984, and these funds have been used to enhance the beauty of Historic Fair View as well as for capital improvements to enhance the property.

Over the last year, your donations to the general fund made it possible for the exterior of the office building to be remodeled, and we added a new security system, storm damage cleanup, and continued beautification of flower gardens and plantings.

The original structure of the office (front and inner section) was built in 1923, with an expansion in 1987. Improvements this year include roof repair and all exterior wood covered in vinyl, along with new soffit and fascia around entire building. New signage and custom welcome mats create a warm feeling near the entrance.

In addition, our maintenance crew has spent several hundred hours grading and preparing for the construction of a new maintenance building. Construction is planned for 2013. You may continue to designate gifts exclusively for this building or contribute to the general foundation, to fund our continued operations.

We welcome the families of Cedar Lawn Memorial Park. Cedar Lawn originated in 1930 and



CEDAR LAWN TREE PLANNING

We've continued to hear growing concern from families connected with Cedar Lawn on the need to cover the maintenance area from view of the Garden of Devotion and Garden of the Cross. Considerable hought and planning on this issue have resulted in a project to begin immediately.

The strategy is to remove twenty-one over-grown pine trees along the back perimeter on the south side. Once the trees and stumps are removed, the ground will be graded to level the garden area. The work is slated to complete by spring 2013, in preparation for the planting of thirty Green Emerald Cypress trees. This will not only improve the grounds but will enhance the beautiful skyline.

Originally, we investigated building a fence along the ridge; however, in considering the cost of the fence compared to a green-friendly solution, we felt planting the trees to be a more fitting option. The total cost for this project is \$12,000. There is still time to send your support for this cleanup and replanting by making a tax-deductible contribution to The Fair View Foundation specifically for Cedar Lawn.
