Consumers are shifting to a preference for cremation and are driving the trend. The cemetery's board of directors recognizes the need to include a variety of options, something special for all burials.

What remains constant is the importance of memorializing and healthy grieving. Keeping that a priority encourages creative options for the cremation interment and memorial. Having a permanent place to visit promotes healthy grieving.

Cremation is a method of preparing the body and does not take the place of a funeral service or monument. A person may choose to be

cremated, but that does not mean he or she does not wish to be honored and memorialized. Cremated remains can still be buried in a family plot or interred in a columbarium. Memorials provide a peaceful focal point where family can visit, and ARE a permanent record for future generations. Much like the love for a loved one, the memorial lasts forever.

The memorial bench has become a popular option at both Fair View and Cedar Lawn. At Cedar Lawn, a small columbarium is being added to the Garden of Devotion to match the existing columbarium. Fair View will soon dedicate a cremation area in the 'Rock Garden" beside the office. Careful planning is underway for the perfect fit of a garden to offer varied priced cremation options.
